### LAY FUNERAL MINISTERS LEADERS TRAINING

#### *Purpose*

To have a dedicated, trained team of lay people who will be able to:

- \*lead families in a time of prayer in the family home or at the funeral home
- \*lead liturgies at the graveside for bereaved families at the time of committal of the deceased
- \*lead liturgies at the crematorium for bereaved families at the time of committal

This dedicated team of lay ministers will ensure:

- \*that families continue to be supported by being led in liturgical prayer during their time of loss.
- \*that parish clergy, especially those in areas with large funeral pressures, will have access to a team of people to support them in the pastoral care of families at a time of bereavement.
- \*that families have a wider pool of people to draw on to lead prayer when there are specific time constraints e.g. time pressures at the crematorium.

The customary expression of the Sign of Peace in Ireland is a handshake. However, other non-contact forms of the sign of peace such as a nod, a bow or a smile are also legitimate expressions of the Sign of Peace. No offence should be taken if someone prefers to express a non-contact Sign of Peace.

The Diocese encourages all to continue to exercise good hygienic practices, particularly over the Christmas season, and if they exhibit flu-like symptoms, they are encouraged to remain at home.
